

Landscapes of the Soul: Co-Creating our World from the Inside-Out.

Armed with stories from the Amazon to Afghanistan, Tasmania to the Blue Mountains, Gary Caganoff will present an exposé of experience and insight into building and sustaining inner resilience while living in a world gone mad, and how to empower ourselves as individuals and as a community to move beyond fear towards creating a more peaceful, compassionate and inclusive society - from the inside-out rather than the outside-in.

In the presentation Gary will highlight the interconnection of the practice of Permaculture as we know it with the lesser known practices of Social Permaculture and the burgeoning explorations of 'Inner Permaculture', or Zone Zero Zero, which explores the unknown personal and collective landscapes of the soul.

Gary has a Masters degree in Social Ecology, a Graduate Diploma in Transpersonal Psychotherapy and practices Permaculture in his garden and in the Blue Mountains community where he lives with his wife and two children.

He is also an award winning documentary filmmaker of 20 years, with his film *The Garden at the End of the World*, featuring Rosemary Morrow in Afghanistan, receiving a global Human Rights Award in 2010.

An earlier film, *The Second Step*, featuring double above-knee leg amputee Warren Macdonald, was the first Australian film to win the Grand Prize at the world's best adventure film festival, the Banff Mountain Film Festival in 2002. It also received seven other international film festival awards and was screened on the ABC and the National Geographic Chanel global network.
